## **Beth's Travels!**

Soprano and Resident Artist, Beth Redwood, embarked on a musical journey that took her across the world earlier this year. In May she travelled to New York City to sing in a production of Mozart's Requiem in Carnegie Hall, under the direction of Dr Margaret Pride. Beth loved the thrill of being in New York and singing in such an iconic venue. After leaving New York, Beth spent a month in Germany with Lyric Opera Studio Weimar. This was an intensive operatic training program aimed at young singers who are preparing to start their professional careers. The main focus of the course was a production of Mozart's Le Nozze Di Figaro in which Beth was playing the leading role of Susanna. It is no mean feat to learn and memorise a three hour long opera in Italian; Susanna is in fact the longest of all Mozart roles and Beth claims she's never had to work so hard in her life!

Aside from music and staging rehearsals, the program also included German lessons, coaching with guest teachers and industry professionals, masterclasses, workshops and agent auditions. However, despite the long 16 hour days, the singers of course found time for a social hour after rehearsals! In the second week, the company travelled to the nearby town of Marburg to perform an Opera Gala at a University House of Residence. This was a very exciting concert and Beth had the pleasure of performing "Meine Lippen Sie Kussen So Heiss" as well as excerpts from Le Nozze Di Figaro. Beth recalls the nerves of singing a German aria for the first time in front of an entirely German audience!

The opera performances were a great success and Beth loved every minute on stage as Susanna, performing with people who had become her very close friends over only a few short weeks. Beth remarks that the small city of Weimar was a beautiful place and (in her rare moments of free time) she very much enjoyed exploring the old town and large parks.

Beth is extremely grateful to her supporters in Perth, and particularly Opera Lovers WA, who generously donated funds to help her in making it to Weimar. It was an incredibly worthwhile experience that greatly developed her vocal and stagecraft skills. Beth is thankful for the wonderful colleagues she met and now has operatic friends all across the globe!


